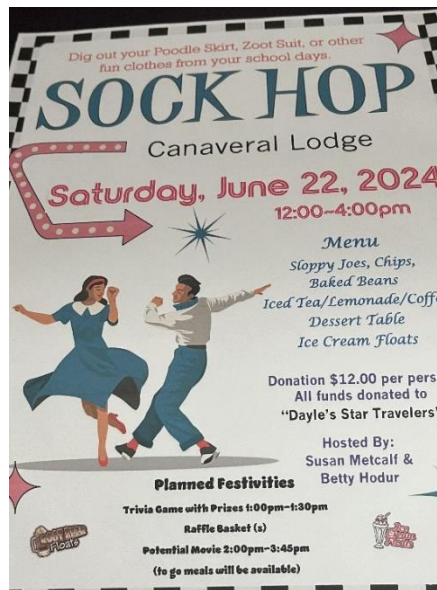

Some meetings conclude with a presentation or unique entertainment. In addition, members and advisors work on different service projects throughout the year.

Since November of 1951, the world headquarters for the International Order of the Rainbow for Girls has been in McAlester, Oklahoma. This magnificent building was constructed for Rainbow Girls and funded by Rainbow Girls.
