

As most of you are aware, The Masonic Home of Florida is in St. Petersburg, Fl, which had a potential of being in harms way due to Hurricane Helene. Luckily, the Home stayed safe. Here's a letter from the Chairman of the Board of Trustees, MW Jorge L. Aladro, P.G.M. :

We were not required to evacuate the Home as we were in a Zone B where we could shelter in place. The storm in itself was not that wet, however, the passing of the storm coincided with high tide and the water from Coffee Pot Bayou was the highest anyone has ever seen. We had to make preparations to internally evacuate the Skill Nursing first floor, however, by 1:00 AM the water started to recede and by 7:00 AM the dock that had been under water since earlier yesterday was back above water.

There is a lot of debris all over the property from small branches to all the trash that was brought in by the high tide and winds.

We are so thankful for the Administrator and Staff, who came in and kept things going and by monitoring the residents and events as they developed. They ran like a fine oiled machine with very little sleep. One can never imagine how complex all these health situations are managed, in coordination with rapidly changing situations and the intertwining of the duties of the different departments.

It was nice to see how well they worked together and even more gratifying that all the decisions were made with a team mentality, with one single focus in mind, to mitigate the impact on the residents and this goal was accomplished simply because of their dedication to the resident's wellbeing.

On the other hand, you could not ask for a more cooperative group of Brothers and Ladies as well as our Guests who through it all maintain the most positive attitude about the whole experience and who are so understanding of the challenges presented and the trust they have on their caregivers to see them through all of this.

This morning, we met with the residents on things going forward and we are working together as a team to put this experience behind us with the best light possible.

I have been here since Tuesday 9/24/24 in preparation of what was to come with Hurricane Helene; the firsthand knowledge and experience was way beyond my expectations. On behalf of the Board of Trustees, the Grand Master, and the Corporate Board I want to thank everyone involved for their professionalism and kindness.
