Hello my Brothers,

Well Christmas has come and gone, and I pray everyone had a great time with Family and you are ready for the challenges of the New Year. We have new officers elected and ready to take us forth in this new year, so how about turning out and show them your support.

I've done some research on a topic that has puzzled me, in that not much has been said other than that which has been disclosed during Degree lectures so here is what I've found on the dot in a circle between two parallel lines.

In every well-regulated lodge there is found a point within a circle, which circle is bordered by two perpendicular parallel lines. These lines represent St. John the Baptist and St. John the Evangelist, the two great patrons of Masonry to whom our Lodges are dedicated, and who are said to have been "perfect parallels in Christianity, as well as Masonry". In those English Lodges which have adopted the "Union System" established by the Grand Lodge of England in 1813, and where the dedication is "to God and his service," the parallel lines represent Moses and Solomon. As a symbol, the parallel lines are not to be found in the earlier rituals of Masonry.

## Something to Ponder

### What is Freemasonry?

How do we answer that question when the uninitiated ask? We could give the stock answer; we make good men better. We who have been in Freemasonry understand that answer, but to the uninitiated that sounds really corny. Or, we could respond: Freemasonry is a system of morality veiled in allegory and illustrated by symbols; but so are religions, so again, to the uninitiated that sounds like another bunch of corn. To the uninitiated, those two answers mean nothing. How do we convey to the uninitiated a sense of Freemasonry?

Actions speak louder than words, or so it has been said. If that's true, then perhaps the retelling of a personal experience can convey the meaning and feeling of Freemasonry we wish to convey to our potential candidates.

Why did you become a Freemason? Maybe you witnessed an interaction between Masons and that convinced you, this is for me. That seems to be the case for William McKinley.

Why did William McKinley become a Mason?

When General Horatio King asked William McKinley how he happen to become a Mason he explained: "After the Battle of Opequam, (County of Frederick, Virginia) I went with our surgeon of our Ohio regiment to the field where there were about 5,000 Confederate prisoners under guard. Almost as soon as we passed the guard, I noticed the doctor shook the hands with a number of Confederate prisoners. He also took from his pocket a roll of bills and distributed all he had among them. Boy-like, I looked on in wonderment; I didn't know what it all meant. On the way back from camp I asked him:

"Did you know these men or ever see them before?"

"No," replied the doctor, "I never saw them before."

"But," I persisted, "You gave them a lot of money, all you had about you. Do you ever expect to get it back?"

"Well" said the doctor, "If they are able to pay me back, they will. But it makes no difference to me; they are brother Masons in trouble and I am only doing my duty."

"I said to myself, if that is Freemasonry, I will take some of it for myself."

And so, William McKinley became a Mason; received his degrees in Hiram Lodge No. 21 in Winchester, Virginia, in 1865, and in 1897, was elected the 25<sup>th</sup> President of the United States.

As Masons, we should be considered at least one step above the average man in the street. We should behave more honorably than the average Joe. We should act according to the precepts we have learned without the expectation of anything in return.

How should Masons act and behave towards one another?

We can easily define unacceptable Masonic behavior, lying, deceit, bullying, manipulation, false promises, etc. How do we define acceptable Masonic behavior? Again, we can provide examples to the candidates. The ideals of Freemasonry are so cherished, that even during times of extreme conflict, the tenets of Freemasonry rise above the discord. We should be engaged in the reciprocal intercourse of kind and friendly acts that promote the welfare and happiness of our brothers. How we act towards one another defines us and our Fraternity.
