Valley Forge was the winter encampment of the Continental Army, under the command of Brother, General George Washington during the American Revolution. The encampment lasted six months, December 19, 1777, to June 19, 1778. Unable to defend Philadelphia from the British, Washington led his 12,000-man army into winter quarters at Valley Forge, about 18 miles northwest of Philadelphia. The Continental Army struggled to manage a disastrous supply crises while simultaneously retraining and reorganizing their units in an effort to mount successful counterattacks against the British. An estimated 1,700 to 2,00 soldiers died at Valley Forge from disease, malnutrition and cold, wet weather.

In 1976, Valley Forge National Historical Park was established and named a national historic site.
