While Equality's number is 2, it is the oldest continuous functioning lodge in IL (according to their Secretary). Both lodges were happy to accommodate this visitor and allowed him to sit in lodge after due examination. It was educational and interesting to witness different jurisdiction's ritual work.

If that wasn't enough, just 3 days later he traveled to Dothan, AL for the FL-GA-AL Tri-State Convention, held at the Dothan Masonic Temple. This was a great experience. The event was attended by the Three Grand Masters of each state: MW: Haskell Vest, Jr. of Florida, MW William Shepard of GA and MW Andrew Barnett of AL. Florida lodge, Orange Park # 267 exemplified the EA degree with WM Lance Holman doing an excellent job, not only in presiding in the East but also delivering the lecture. This was followed by Georgia lodge, Tyrian # 111 (Warner Robins) exemplifying the FC degree, again, an excellent presentation by their degree team. Lastly, Alabama lodge, conferred the MM degree on a "real" FC of AL. Can you imagine the stories he will be able to tell his children that he was raised where 3 Grand Masters and more than 117 masons from 3 states were in attendance?

All in all, Bro Brian was able to get 2 more pins for his jacket! He's always looking for more.
